GLAMORGAN KEEPS FEES LOW

As you may know, fees to study at English universities are set to rise to between GBP6-9,000 per year in 2012. However, the fees for the **University of Glamorgan** will remain approximately the same as this year. This means that **TASMAC**, **ETHames Graduate School** and **Glamorgan** will all be offering courses at much lower fees than English universities.

Glamorgan is a state university so it will still be possible to apply for the interest-free, inflation-linked loan.
