CHANGE OF RULES FOR FEES LOAN

The British Government has introduced new rules relating to the availability of interest free loans to pay student fees.

These loans may not now be available for students applying to study courses at a level equal to – or below the level of - qualifications already held. Therefore, if you will possess a bachelor's degree or master's degree when you start your studies in England, you may not be entitled to the interest-free loan if starting a bachelor's course.

There are, however, exceptions to these new rules, so you should still complete EU9N and wait for a decision.



GETTING A JOB IN ENGLAND

*There are still jobs available for students

*Universities have job shops to help you find work

*Work permits not required. You simply need to register.

*The job shop can help you complete all necessary documentation

*You can also try private employment agencies – there are lots of them!

*Minimum wage for 2009/10: £5.80 per hr (21 yrs +)
